

THE ROCHAMBEAU UNVEILING.

Programme for the Exercises in Washington on the 24th Inst.

WASHINGTON, May 6.—The committee having charge of the ceremonies connected with the unveiling of the statue of Rochambeau on the 24th inst. has prepared a general programme as follows:

Opening remarks by Chairman of the Entertainment Committee, Herbert H. D. Pierce, Third Assistant Secretary of State.

Invocation by his Eminence Cardinal James Gibbons.

Remarks by the President of the United States.

Unveiling by Countess Rochambeau, with music, "The Marseillaise," by Marine Band.

Presentation of the sculptor, Ferdinand Hamar, by the Chairman of the committee.

Remarks by his Excellency M. Jules Cambon, the French Ambassador, (in French.)

Music by the French Band.

Remarks by his Excellency Gen. Horace Porter, United States Ambassador to France.

Music by the Marine Band.

Address by H. C. Lodge, United States Senate.

Music, "The Star-Spangled Banner," by the Marine Band.

Remarks by Gen. Brugere.

Benediction by Bishop Satterlee.

It is said that the original plan of having an imposing military demonstration has been abandoned in favor of simplicity. The military representation probably will be confined to some troops from Fort Myer and Washington Barracks and detachments of marines and sailors. The French military forces will be represented by a large military band and a detachment of marines, who are coming over on the battleship Gaulois with the members of the Government party, headed by Gen. Brugere of the French Army.
